When did you join the TAS team? August 2020


What do you enjoy most about your role? I enjoy fixing things for the teachers and taking care of the oval and the rest of the school grounds.

Student Free Day

During our Student Free day yesterday, the staff at Tintinara Area School were busy learning, utilising two workshop sessions throughout the day. Our teachers are actively and continually improving in the learning areas of Spelling and Mathematics. In our first session, Louise Hanrahan from the Literacy Guarantee Unit delivered a workshop focusing on Spelling, with an emphasis on the program 'Spelling Mastery'. We are excited to implement this program into our Years 3-8 classes beginning in 2022. This will compliment InitialLit, which is currently being applied in our Early Years.

The second workshop was associated with the 'Big 6 in Number', presented by Kathy Palmer via Microsoft Teams. Staff were able to consolidate their prior learning and develop strategies to help improve students learning across the year levels. The Big 6 in Number has a focus on five areas, with students progressing through the different stages when they have full mastery of each stage.
