Hello and welcome to the 2024 Ag Program. We have been very busy already, and only getting busie We kicked off the year with a big clean up of the Ag Block, with the Year 3 and 4 s having a great time pulling out plants that had died over the summer, and some of the Year 5 and 6 girls doing a fabulous job of tiding up our shadehouse area so that it is a bit more user friendly when trying to find pots. Steve and Kate Manser visited to run me through the iFarm, involving filming some very useful videos which he term, which will be grown in the ifarm all year round hopefully! Week 3 saw the arrival of our first batch of chicks for the year, which will be grown to point-of-lay, with regular weigh ins by the Year $5 / 6$ class to track their growth over the semester. The $3 / 4 \mathrm{~s}$ and 7 s were able to enjoy mere very cute and seepy chick cuddles. We have a mixture of breeds, which will also be compared as the grow. Please see the ad about chickens if you are interested in purchasing any.


Week 5 and 6 has seen the Year 7s get more hands on with sheep, through weighing the 'leftover' wethers from 2023 prior to them being sold, and then assisting with shearing of the new 2024 wethers. A massive thank you to the Vandeleur family, the Richardson family and Chase Ferguson for supplying the wethers
for 2024. A massive thank you also to our 'Jack of All Trades' groundsman Mark Richardson who did the shearing, and showed the Year 7 s a few tips about sheep. The sheep will be spending some time settling in in the paddock for a couple weeks before being housed in the sheltered area, with the first batch of grain mix kindly supplied by Josh Richardson
Now the focus turns to getting the steers to school and onto feed, with breaking in being conducted over the holidays. We currently have 1 steer confirmed at this stage, and hopefully have another 1 or 2 in the works. If you are able to possibly supply us with a purebred steer, could you please get in contact. We will hopefully be receiving the steers sometime between Week 9 to 11
Show teams have been made extra-curricula this year, so the students have nominated themselves for either Steers or Sheep already. There will be a letter coming out to those parents with some extra Lastly, a big thank you to everyone in the community that has. already provided me so much support in the ast 6 weeks. The Ag program would not run as well as it does without you, so thank you.

## School Sores

 We have been notified school sores have been identified throughout the school.Please keep an eye out for the following symptoms:
School sores appear as a flat, yellow, crusty or moist patches on the skin (see image), usually on exposed parts of the body such as the face and legs. The sores are often greater than 1cm in diameter.

School sores are extremely infectious as long as there is disc harge from the sores. Children are to rema in at home until appropriate treatment has commenced. Any sores on exposed surfaces should be completely covered with a dressing.

## Treatment for school sores

Your doctor may recommend antibiotic cream for mild and
 multiple school sores and recurent school sores.
