Congratulations to the 40 students representing the school at the Interschool competition on Tuesday 12th March at the Tintinara Town Oval.

Work on the pool continues tiling, painting and the construction of the surrounding fence has been completed. I am eagerly looking forward to the completion and opening ceremony. More information about the opening ceremony will become available closer to the date. Swimming lessons for all Reception to Year 6 students, will commence in Term 4.

Students in Year 3, 5, 7 and 9 will take part in NAPLAN testing starting on Wednesday 13th March. NAPLAN provides a 'snapshot' of student achievements in literacy and numeracy and results may be impacted by worry or stress during the test. Teachers and schools use a range of measures to check student progress including formative classwork, PAT (Progressive Achievement Test) and semester reports with A-E grading. Students will be provided with a timetable which outlines each test time and date. If you have any concerns regarding NAPLAN, please contact myself or the classroom teacher.

Parent Teacher Interviews will be held during week 10 of this term. Each interview will have a timeslot of 15 minutes, if you would like more time with the teachers, please book a double session. More information on dates and times will come home next week.

Well, what a fantastic Sports Day we have had at Tintinara for 2024!

It all started on Monday where we held our 'Pre Sports Day' and were able to get through a few of the events. Some of the efforts across the afternoon were terrific (and gave our existing records a fright!), one of which saw Hannah Harkness fall 1cm short of breaking the Triple Jump record! Ellis Todd got within 12 seconds of the 800m record It was a great turn out from parents which was really pleasing to see and the cheering/enthusiasm from the students was a sign of things to come for Thursday.

Thursday rolled around and it was a great buzz around the place prior to the start of the day! Events went off without a problem and despite some warmish weather and a slow start to the day which put us behind time, things went well! We saw some excellent individual efforts, which included witnessing some serious speed from Dylan Mann, who came within 1 second of the 100m record and 2 seconds of the 200m record. Sidney Vandeleur broke the Discus record with a throw of 21.66m and Daisy Vandeleur broke the 400m record for Under 11 girls with a time of 1 minute and 9 seconds. It was terrific to see across the day, some excellent examples of sportsmanship and compassion for one another, highlighted by a couple of efforts (amongst many others), such as Logan Kelsall running over to check on an injured participant after doing his 400m run, whilst Mackenzie Fatchen stopped everything to check on an injured competitor in the High Jump. Well done to those and for everybody else who took time to stop and check in on others.

Well done to everyone for showing so much enthusiasm throughout the day. I have many people to thank for helping it run smoothly, but parents for just generally being there to support and help with events, I thank you so much, along with staff for doing a wonderful job of fulfilling there roles throughout the day. Thankyou to the Governing Council for running the BBQ and the Year 8-10 students for making cupcakes to sell!



Hello and welcome to the 2024 Ag Program. We have been very busy already, and only getting busier. We kicked off the year with a big clean up of the Ag Block, with the Year 3 and 4s having a great time pulling out plants that had died over the summer, and some of the Year 5 and 6 girls doing a fabulous job of tiding up our shadehouse area so that it is a bit more user friendly when trying to find pots.

Steve and Kate Manser visited to run me through the iFarm, involving filming some very useful videos which will be used to teach the Year 7s and 5/6s how to use the system. Keep an eye out for produce for sale later in the term, which will be grown in the iFarm all year round hopefully!

Week 3 saw the arrival of our first batch of chicks for the year, which will be grown to point-of-lay, with regular weigh ins by the Year 5/6 class to track their growth over the semester. The 3/4s and 7s were able to enjoy some very cute and sleepy chick cuddles. We have a mixture of breeds, which will also be compared as they grow. Week 5 and 6 has seen the Year 7s get more hands on with sheep, through weighing the 'leftover' wethers from 2023 prior to them being sold, and then assisting with shearing of the new 2024 wethers. A massive thank you to the Vandeleur family, the Richardson family and Chase Ferguson for supplying the wethers for 2024. A massive thank you also to our 'Jack of All Trades' groundsman Mark Richardson who did the shearing, and showed the Year 7s a few tips about sheep. The sheep will be spending some time settling in in the paddock for a couple weeks before being housed in the sheltered area, with the first batch of grain mix kindly supplied by Josh Richardson.





School Sores

We have been notified school sores have been identified throughout the school.



Please keep an eye out for the following symptoms:

School sores appear as a flat, yellow, crusty or moist patches on the skin (see image), usually on exposed parts of the body such as the face and legs. The sores are often greater than 1cm in diameter.

School sores are extremely infectious as long as there is discharge from the sores. Children are to remain at home until appropriate treatment has commenced. Any sores on exposed surfaces should be completely covered with a dressing.

Treatment for school sores

Your doctor may recommend antibiotic cream for mild and localised school sores. Antibiotics by mouth may be needed for multiple school sores and recurrent school sores.
