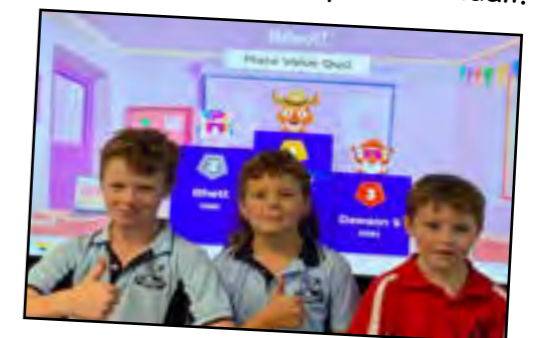

### SCHOOL SORES

**We have been notified school sores have been identified throughout the school.**

**Please keep an eye out for the following symptoms:**

School sores appear as a flat, yellow, crusty or moist patches on the skin (see image), usually on exposed parts of the body such as the face and legs. The sores are often greater than 1cm in diameter.

School sores are extremely infectious as long as there is discharge from the sores. Children are to remain at home until appropriate treatment has commenced. Any sores on exposed surfaces should be completely covered with a dressing.

#### Treatment for school sores

Your doctor may recommend antibiotic cream for mild and localised school sores. Antibiotics by mouth may be needed for multiple school sores and recurrent school sores.

**TINTINARA AREA SCHOOL**  
**PARENT COMPLAINT POLICY**  
 TOGETHER WE ACHIEVE SUCCESS

**Introduction:**  
 Student learning is at the centre of everything we do including the social and emotional well being of students. Conflict can often result from misunderstandings. Therefore it is important that the school and home have open and transparent lines of communication and a 'no blame approach' to any issue that may arise. It is acknowledged that some issues may require higher level intervention as an initial starting point. Wherever possible individuals should adhere to the process outlined to seek satisfactory resolution to grievances.

**Grievance Procedures:**  
 Rights and responsibilities of the individuals involved

- To communicate honestly
- To reflect on the issue or concern
- To seek constructive solutions
- To expect opinions to be heard and sought
- To be supported throughout the process
- To be listened to
- To be given the opportunity to present all sides to an issue
- To maintain confidentiality
- To expect that agreed actions are adhered to
- To have the right to information according to DfE policies
- To consult outside agencies at any stage of the proceedings
- To have the matter dealt with in a timely manner

**Guidelines:**

- Raise the issue with the school in a calm and rational manner, bearing in mind that you have one side of an issue.
- Be prepared to talk specifics. That is, be prepared to talk about your own child and a particular incident.
- Parents can use an advocate (support person) to assist them in raising an issue.
- The grievances need to be kept confidential.
- At times, you may seek support from friends to gauge their reaction. It is important to do this wisely.
- At all times, it is important for the student's sake that the school and the teacher are not criticised in the student's hearing.
- When a grievance is discussed, the student involved needs to hear that there is confidence that it will be resolved at the school level.
- The school can only deal with issues that are raised in this way. If we are not approached about any concerns, then we assume that all is well.

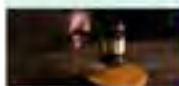

The course focuses on practical driver awareness, resulting in a true perspective, not the one their peers have given them. Prevention is better than cure and what they are at risk.

### Course content includes:

- Basic car dynamics and control skills
- Emergency braking
- Within two wheels are off the bottom
- Safe steering
- Wildlife dangers
- Understanding speed, fatigue, alcohol, peer pressure
- Safe following distances
- Car modification (what's real and what's not)
- Observation techniques
- Emergency collision avoidance
